Road Watch

KESAB Road Watch is an enjoyable and educational litter clean-up and environment program focusing on the upkeep and improvement of our roads in South Australia. It aims to increase the natural beauty of our great state for the enjoyment of residents and visitors alike.

Who are the Road Watch Volunteers?

KESAB welcomes individuals, service clubs, schools,

households, resident groups, businesses and community associations of any age and size to become part of the Road Watch family who 'adopt' a



section of road in SA to keep litter free and safe.

What do Road Watchers do?

On an annual basis, we require our Road Watchers to carry out a minimum of four clean-ups along your adopted section of road. Additional clean ups can be organised during the year if the need arises in your particular area. We encourage our Road Watchers to recycle deposit items, as well as glass and metal and to dispose of the rubbish collected at your local Transfer Station or by arrangement with your local council.

Road Watch groups can also become involved in roadside vegetation work. Graffiti removal may also be of interest to your group and can be discussed further with the KESAB Coordinator.

Tell us what you found...

By completing a short report online via the KESAB website following each clean-up, the information gathered assists with future planning and to build up a litter profile of our roads and highways across the state. Identifying 'Black Spot' high volume litter areas or areas used for hard waste dumping are ways we can increase the awareness of the effects of littering.

Road Watchers' Kit

KESAB will provide a Road Watch Support Kit which consists of volunteer safety signs, high visibility vests, disposal bags, grabbers and gloves.

We appreciate your hard work!

If you adopt a 2 kilometre section of roadway for a minimum 2 year period, KESAB will provide a permanent roadside sign erected in your Road Watch Area, publicising your efforts to your local community and beyond.



Where do I start?

Establish the section of road you wish to adopt (minimum 500 metres), and then register on the KESAB website. We will follow up with your Group Coordinator to discuss in further detail any queries regarding Road Watch e.g. arrangements with your council for the removal of rubbish to the Transfer Station, safety for the group, and anything else that might be of interest to those who share your concern for our environment.
